2 Look for financial transparency

Red flag:

 Referring offices share space, staff, or billing systems with the surgical practice without disclosing a formal business relationship.

Ethical standard:

 Referring providers disclose any ownership or financial relationship openly—or better yet, avoid them altogether.





3 No Pressure to Stay In-Network

What to avoid:

- Feeling pressured to stay with the in-house or "partner" surgeon.
- Limited or no discussion of alternatives

Kickback-free tip:

 Ethical providers offer you options and encourage second opinions when appropriate.





4 Check Surgeon Credentials and Independence

Do your homework:

- Is the cataract surgeon board-certified?
- Do they have fellowship training or unique expertise?
- Are they part of a kickback-free, independently owned practice?

5 Watch for Marketing That Looks Like Medicine

Unethical signal:

- Referrals come from flashy marketing, discounts, or package deals bundled by optometrists or general clinics.
- If your doctor's office displays marketing (like window decals) for external surgery centers, it may point to a financial tie.

Ethical clue:

 Referrals are made by medical doctors who have no financial gain in your decision and only your health in mind.
